OUR PROGRAMS













Each year, we respond to dozens of new and ongoing disasters, emergencies, and conflicts around the world. We provide humanitarian assistance to thousands of people to ensure they receive food, clean water, healthcare and shelter when they need it most.

SYRIA

EMERGENCY RELIEF KITS

Idlib, Syria

Penny Appeal Canada distributed Emergency Relief Kits to IDP (internally displaced persons) who fled from the conflict in Idlib, Syria.

The Emergency Relief kits included monthly food packages and hygiene kits. The food packages included items such as bulgur, rice, sugar, lentils, beans, chickpeas, and cooking oil. Hygiene kits were composed of hand soap, detergent, toothbrushes, shampoo, and women's products.

The beneficiaries selected for the distribution were those who had no assistance for almost two months and were on the brink of starvation.

With your support we were able to help a community of 2000 people living in IDP camps.

SYRIA

RAQQA MOBILE CLINIC



As a result of the continued conflict in Syria, 60% of hospitals are now closed and there is a massive shortage in staff and medicine. This leaves millions of people vulnerable; especially the 6.2 million internally displaced persons (IDP) in Syria, many of whom are living in informal camps and makeshift shelters.

We supported the delivery of essential medical care in Raqqa City with a mobile clinic to provide gynaecological and prenatal support to pregnant and non-pregnant women. Psychosocial support was also provided to women who have suffered psychological trauma of war.

With your support, we were able to provide 9000 women and children with quality medical and paediatric care.



KASHMIR

EARTHQUAKE RESPONSE

Mirpur District, Kashmir, Pakistan

In September 2019, A 5.8 magnitude earthquake shocked East Pakistan and affected two districts in Azad Jammu and Kashmir, Mirpur and Bhimber.

We responded to this earthquake by facilitating the distribution of winter items, clothing and shelter materials to victims of the earthquake in the most affected communities.

We distributed tents, tarpaulin sheets, and winter kits which included blankets, shawls, sweaters, wool hats, and socks which benefited over 300 households.





ZAKATUL FITR

South Africa & Pakistan

In 2019, we disbursed your Fitra in South Africa and Pakistan. Fitra was given in the form of food parcels to families prior to Eid-ul-Fitr.

In South Africa, your Fitra was disbursed in three provinces: Kwa-Zulu Natal, Western Cape, and Guateng.

In Pakistan, your Fitra was disbursed in Tharpakar, Layyah, and Khanewal.

UGANDA AGRICULTURE VILLAGE

¶ Madi Okolo Village, Arua District, Uganda

The goal of this agriculture village project is to support poor communities, particularly women, orphans, children and the elderly, improve their livelihood and food security through sustainable agriculture and skills training.

The community will benefit from training on sustainable agriculture and skills for self- reliance, including animal rearing and kitchen gardens so as to empower them financially.

Construction of the agriculture village is set to begin in July 2020.


QURBANI

¶ India & Uganda

In India, we performed 11,356 Qurbanis. The meat provided through this helped address the food needs of 84,000 individuals in the areas of Bihar, Jarkhand, Odisha, Uttar Pradesh, and West Bengal.

in Uganda, we performed 2000 Qurbanis and distributed it to 3010 individuals in the villages of Laboke, Bondo, Keri and Lobe.





Senegal Forgotten Children

🖁 Dakar, Senegal

This program aims to provide 350 children in Daraas (Quran and Cultural educational centres) with health, safety, well-being and good hygiene to ensure the safety of the children.

The children are also taught vocational skills, income generating activities and capacity building to encourage self-suficiency and sustainability.

Morocccan Children's Trust

Souss-Massa, Morocco

This project will support the Moroccan Children's Trust (MCT) in its mission to promote gatekeeping practices to encourage deinstitutionalisation and reduce the level of street connection for children.

Through holistic gatekeeping initiatives – such as social work, collaboration with stakeholders, and outreach and advocacy – this project will advocate for and act on the protection of children, youth, and women in Souss-Massa, Morocco.

This program is expected to help support and protect 100 children.



NEPAL

WASH Project

We increased access to safe and quality drinking water (facilities at school, health institution, households and community) for needy and marginalized people (including students) in the project area by digging wells.

Conducted seminars to raise awareness to communities about the significance of hygiene, water waste management and tube well maintenance for needy and marginalized people.

BANGLADESH

WASH Project

We ensured safe drinking water for disaster prone communities and established gender friendly WASH (Water Sanitation and Hygiene) facilities at the educational institute with facilities for Menstrual Hygiene Management (MHM).

Direct Beneficiaries: 800 people School: 225 female students



BANGLADESH

Solar Water Power Centre

Construction will begin in July 2020 on our Solar Water Pump and Power Centre in Shyamnagar Upazila, Bangladesh for a community of 2600 marnialized people.

This solar water pump and power centre will improve hygiene practices and behaviour on a sustainable basis, whilst ensuring adequate safe water supply and solar energy.

NIGERIA

WASH Program

Penny Appeal Canada's WASH program in Nigeria will begin on July 1st 2020.

Its aim is to improve the health of rural populations in Benue State by providing access to year-round sources of safe drinking water, promoting improved hygiene and sanitation practices, and building capacities of participating communities to sustainably manage their own water facilities.

The expected results of this program are:

- New access to safe drinking water for at least 32 communities through rehabilitation of handpump boreholes.
- Reduce incidence of diarrhoeal disease in children under-five in targeted communities.
- Reduction in time spent by women and children collecting water, leading to an increase in available time for women to be economically productive and for children to attend school.

Penny Appeal Canada will be implementing an online therapy program in collaboration with Naseeha.

Certified professionals will guide you through the Covid-19 global pandemic and any other issues you would like to seek help with.



Penny Appeal Canada will be sponsoring a full-year of group therapy sessions and scholarships to fund respite service, adaptive equipment and/or direct therapy.



Penny Appeal Canada will be assisted Sakeenah Homes with the opening of their new transition home for Muslim women and children in Brampton. This will be a place for individuals that are going through pain and need to turn to a place for comfort and transition to a life that we all deserve.



Penny Appeal Canada will be assisting Nisa Homes with the opening of a new transition home in Ottawa for Muslim women and children fleeing domestic violence, experiencing homelessness, poverty or forced resettlement.



Penny Appeal Canada will be providing funds to DEEN Support Services to help newcomers with disabilities in Canada learn English and vital life skills through the drop in day program. DEEN operates programs for individuals with disabilities and ensures they are provided the same opportunities as everyone else.



Penny Appeal Canada will provide support for 68 cataract surgeries to OBAT Canada's Eyesight Restoration Program for Rohingya refugees in Bangladesh.

COVID-19 RESPONSE


Penny Appeal Canada joined the Canadian Muslim Response Network to help respond to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The goal of the project was to provide vulnerable and at-risk populations with essential hygiene and food items to help ease the COVID-19 burden and allow families to self-isolate safely.

Each Family Hygiene kit includes but is not limited to: soap, shampoo, conditioner, female hygiene items, toothbrush, toothpaste house-hold cleaning supplies and much more. Each family kit will support a family of 4 for several weeks.

Distribution of these kits took place throughout Canada.
