1,000 ORPHANS SPONSORED!

Your monthly sponsorship combined with the generosity of others has helped us provide education, school supplies and food packs to orphaned children aged 4–15 in Pakistan in Quarter 1.

We distributed our quarterly food pack to the families of the orphan children through distributions hosted at 54 central locations. Each food pack consisted of:

- 20 kilograms wheat flour
- 5 kilograms rice
- 3 litres oil
- 5 kilograms sugar

- 4 kilograms pulses
- 4 kilograms lentils
- 4 kilograms red beans
- 1.6 kilograms salt

Why we are doing it:

With 153 million orphaned children worldwide and 5,700 additional orphaned children everyday, there is a need to care for these vulnerable children and their families.

What does our OrphanKind program provide:

School tuition paid directly to the school of the child, school supplies consisting of backpack, textbooks and workbooks, notebooks, stationary items, school uniform, socks, and shoes.

CASE STUDY 1



Zain Ali
Grade 4

BACKGROUND

Zain's father Anayat Ali passed away 7 years ago after battling cancer for 5 months. Anayat was a labourer who earned little but as his condition grew worse his income also progressively declined. Zain, his elderly mother Kaneez Bibi, brother Hasnain, and sister Fiza were left grieving and struggling to make ends meet.

ACCOMODATIONS

Shortly after the death of his father, Zain's house was completely damage and in need of serious repairs. Zain's relatives and community members supported the family and helped them reconstruct a one room house without a separate kitchen space.

FINANCIAL SITUATION

Since Anayat Ali's death, Zain's older brother Hasnain has become the primary earning for the family. Hasnain works as a contract truck loader where he loads trucks with sand and stone. Unfortunately for the family, this contact work does not guarantee a stable income. Due to a lack of stable income, Zain's family is unable to meet their basic needs.

IMPACT OF ORPHANKIND

The OrphanKind program has provided Zain with an education and his family with access to food. When Zain grows up he plans on becoming an army officer. With the financial challenges the family faces due to an insatiable source of income, they are grateful to be able to receive free education for Zain and food for the whole family on a quarterly basis.

CASE STUDY 2



Tayyaba Noor
Grade 8

BACKGROUND

Tayyaba is in grade 8 and lives with her mother Saqia Ilyas, two sisters Azba and Hooriya, one brother Ahsan. In 2018, Tayyaba's father passed away due to a heart attack. He used to put up billboards for a living earning PKR 40,000 a month. When he passed away, members of the community stepped in to provide the family with financial support by providing them with donations to meet their basic needs.

ACCOMODATIONS

Tayaba, her mother and three siblings live in a home they own which consists of 2 rooms, a storage room and a washroom.

FINANCIAL SITUATION

Since the death of her husband, Saqia has taken up tailoring to generate an income. She earns about PKR 5,000 which is not sufficient to run a household. Luckily, for Saqia and her children, the community continues to provide them with financial support to meet their basic needs; however, this is inconsistent and cannot be relied upon.

IMPACT OF ORPHANKIND

The OrphanKind program has addressed one of the greatest challenges for Tayyaba's family which is access to consistent food ration. The quarterly food pack that Tayyaba's family receives provides them with a consistent and reliable source of food. In the future Tayyaba plans on being a doctor to help families in need.

CASE STUDY 3



Aleeza Shareef

BACKGROUND

Aleeza lives with her mom, Sakeena Bibi and has four married sisters Mahnaaz, Sonia, Komal, and Fizza in Azad Jammu and Kashmir. Aleeza's father died in 2006 due to blood cancer. He was the primary earner for his family and after his death he left behind a wife and five daughters without a source of income. To generate an income, Sakeena Bibi has taken up working as a tailor in her village. Sakeena Bibi's income makes it difficult and challenging for her to fulfill the basic needs of her daughters including education and food.

ACCOMODATIONS

Aleeza and her mother live in a home consisting of two rooms and one washroom. The condition of the small shelter indicates that they are in need of permanent housing.

FINANCIAL SITUATION

Aleeza's mother does not have a stable source of income. As a tailor, Sakeena Bibi earns PKR 6,000 which is not enough to meet their monthly needs. Due to their financial situation, Aleeza and her mother struggle accessing food, health, and clothing.

IMPACT OF ORPHANKIND

This project has a huge impact on Aleeza's family due to the support of the education and the food ration that they will be receiving under this project. This way Sakeena Bibi will be able to plan for the construction of a small house for themselves and look towards Aleeza's higher education. She wants to be a teacher in the future so that she can help to spread the light of education.
