We provided extremely vulnerable families with fresh meat in 9 countries around the world through the provision of Qurbani meat during Eid Al-Adha. In each country we worked with local community partners to identify households with the greatest need and provided them with 3–5kg of Qurbani meat on behalf of our donors.

Why?

Eid al-Adha is celebrated by Muslims around the world to commemorate the completion of Hajj. As part of this celebration, Muslims honour Prophet Ibrahim (AS) through the obligatory sacrificial slaughter of animals, known as Qurbani. Penny Appeal Canada is committed to making this religious obligation accessible.

This year, we carried out Qurbani for our donors in India, Pakistan, Bangladesh, Uganda, South Africa, Zimbabwe, Yemen, Palestine and Canada in order to address the immediate nutritional needs in each of these countries. With COVID-19, families who were already vulnerable are facing increased financial insecurity.

What we achieved?

We performed 7922 Qurbanis.

India: 5445 (shares of cow)

Uganda: 500 (shares of goat)

Pakistan: 565 (shares of cow)

Bangladesh: 245 (shares of cow)

Yemen: 32 (shares of sheep)

Palestine: 46 (shares of cow)

Zimbabwe: (shares of goat)

South Africa: (shares of sheep)

Canada: 46 (shares of sheep)
